¹⁷ Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here! ¹⁸ All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation: ¹⁹ that God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting people s sins against them. And he has committed to us the message of reconciliation. ²⁰ We are therefore Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making his appeal through us. **2 Corinthians 5**

The American Worldview Inventory, a survey of the religious life of American adults, recently did an assessment of the worldviews of four generations: millennials (born 1984-2002), Gen X (1965-1983), baby boomers (1946-1964) and builders (1927-1945).

The findings of this inventory should animate us as Christians to the importance of our task. Just 26% of Gen X and 16% of millennials believe that when they die, they will go to heaven only because they confessed their sins and received Jesus Christ as their savior. Additionally, 43% of millennials stated they either don't know, don't care or don't believe God exists. That is getting very close to one-half of our 20–40-year-olds.

These numbers are not representative of a land far, far away. These numbers hit home. And so, as Pentecost Sunday arrives on May 23, we have an opportunity and a reminder to reexamine and renew our purpose, to walk in step with the fire of the Spirit that enlivens the believer in the new life. Paul describes the work of a Christian as that of an ambassador, one who walks and lives among foreigners, and represents the place from which they come.

Jesus taught his disciples to pray, "Your Kingdom come..." As ambassadors of God's Kingdom, we are enlisted into the action of bringing God's Kingdom to bear on earth. Pentecost, that event recorded in Acts 2 that really empowered God's people to follow through with that work, is also a living reality today. Yes, today, it is only in the power of the Spirit that we become willing and able to do the great work of an ambassador. Clearly, we have plenty to do, and our engagement in this work of gaining contact and speaking the life of God's forgiveness, love and hope is the driving impulse of the Christian life.

Being ambassadors. Making disciples. Lord, may your will be done among us.


